Kenneth B. Jaggears of Gadsden, has been appointed deputy equal employment opportunity officer at Ft. McClellan, making him the first civilian appointed to that position.

The position was established at Ft. McClellan, as it has been in all medium and large installations throughout the United States which hire a large civilian force, to keep personnel informed and to help better the understanding of equal rights for minority groups.

Serving under the technical control of the Department of Army Equal Employment Opportunity Officer in Washington, D. C., Jaggears is responsible for developing and directing a program which will provide equal employment opportunities for all employes and applicants for employment without regard to race, creed, color or national origin.

Some of his plans for the coming year include visiting high schools, trade schools and colleges in the area, assisting operating officials in group or individual counseling and maintaining an exchange of ideas and successful techniques to
